Rakshita Ramesh of SB Mahaveer Jain PU College, VV Puram, Bengaluru, secured first rank in Indian Systems of Medicine (ISM) & Homoeopathy with a score of 96.667% in the CET, She also secured first rank in CET for BSc (Agriculture).

Though she could now get easy entry to these courses, Rakshita is keen on securing a seat for MBBS, preferably in the Bangalore Medical College and Research Institute.

HRD ministry for making father's name optional on degrees

NEW DELHI: The Human Resource Development (HRD) ministry has favoured Union Minister Maneka Gandhi's request for scrapping the rule stipulating the compulsory mention of the father's name on academic certificates.

It, however, needs to find out if mentioning the student's father's name for his/her academic certificates is mandatory in higher education.

"That's a good suggestion. If somebody wants to mention his/her mother's name, it's his/her choice. We will look into it to see if mentioning the father's name is

mandatory," HRD Minister Prakash Javadekar said.

The ministry will ask the University Grants Commission (UGC) to look into the matter.


"So far we understand that mentioning the father's name in a student's certificate should not be mandatory. I know some cases where students submitted the name of their mother for the academic records with their educational institutions, instead of giving the name of their father. The issue brought to the notice of the ministry by Maneka Gandhi, however, needs to be examined," an official

said.

In case of any ambiguity in the rules, the UGC and other regulatory bodies can issue a notification to the higher educational institutions, clarifying that a student can mention the name of his/her mother, instead of the name of the father, for his/her academic records and certificates, the official added.

Last month, Maneka wrote to Javadekar, requesting him to consider changing the rules to enable single mothers put their names on the academic certificates of their wards.

350 medical seats added to State's kitty

1.25 lakh students to vie for about 55,000 seats

On a day when the Common Entrance Test results were declared, the State government announced that 350 medical seats have been added to Karnataka's kitty.

This year, medical and dental seat aspirants will obtain seats based on their National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) scores.

Medical Education Minister Sharanprakash R. Patil on Tuesday said there were around 8,680 seats (including the 350 new seats) in 56 medical colleges across the State.

Sources in the Medical Education Department said the 350 additional seats were in the seven existing government college.

After the NEET ranks are announced, the Karnataka Examinations Authority would prepare a rank list and allot seats based on Number of students who appeared for CET

them. Meanwhile, nearly 1.25 lakh students who have been allotted ranks will be vying for about 55,000 seats in engineering colleges across the State.

The results of the CET, for which 1.8 lakh appeared,

were announced on Tuesday by Higher Education Minister Basavaraj Rayaraddi and Dr. Patil.

The number of candidates who were eligible to obtain engineering seats in 2016 was 1.27 lakh. Compared with this year, 1,716 candidates more candidates were eligible to obtain engineering seats last year.

Sources, however, said although the competition was tough this time also, many engineering seats would still remain unfilled as many seats maybe from engineering colleges that are of "poor quality" and as a result would have no takers.

Mr. Rayaraddi said the candidates who have bagged the top five ranks in all streams were eligible for free seats.

He said the top-five candidates from Hyderabad Karnataka region would also be given free seats this year.

NEET may become must for foreign medical courses

Chennai: The Union health ministry may soon make the National Eligibility Entrance Test mandatory for students who travel abroad for undergraduate medical courses, Medical Council of India officials have said.

A ministry has suggested that students who do not clear NEET should not be given the 'no objection certificate' to study in foreign universities.

"Without the no-objection certificate it will be impossible for students to practice in India. They will neither be allowed to sit for the screening examination nor be registered by medical councils as doctors," said MCI vice-president Dr CV Bhirmanandham. The council, the Chennai-based cardiologist said, was waiting for orders from the ministry on whether it should be imple-



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mented this academic year.

The move will also make the entry level qualification for medical education equal for all candidates. In April 2016, the Supreme Court made NEET mandatory for undergraduate and postgraduate medical and dental admissions. "As of now we feel the quality of students who go abroad is not great because less than a quarter of students clear the screening

test every year," he said.

The Indian Medical Council Act, 2001, mandates citizens with undergraduate degrees from outside India to clear the screening test conducted every June and December, with a 50% score, before doing a one-year internship in an MCI-recognised medical college. The number of students taking the test has doubled, but the pass percentage dropped from 50.12 in 2005 to 10.7 in 2015.

In this period, the pass rate fluctuated around 20%, dropping to an all-time low of 4.93% in June 2014, when only 293 students passed. While most students claim the test is tough and questions are from PG medical tests, National Board of Examination officials say the question paper is similar to the one given to Indian students appearing for NEET PG. There is no negative marking.
