Govt, medical colleges agree on 10% fee increase for MBBS course for next 3 yrs

BENGALURU, DHNS: The fee for MBBS courses in government and private medical colleges is set to increase by 10% a year over the next three academic years.

The decision was taken at a meeting on Wednesday between representatives of private medical colleges and medical education minister Dr Sharanprakash Patil.

For 2017-18 academic year, the MBBS course fees in government colleges and for students allotted governmentquota seats in private colleges is expected to increase from Rs 70,000 to Rs 77,000. Similarly, the fee in private medical colleges may increase from Rs 5.75 lakh to Rs 6.35 lakh.

No decision was arrived at on increasing fee for dental courses and it would be decided at another meeting to be held within two to three days.

"In other states, the MBBS course fee is more than Rs 10 lakh. Pointing this out, private medical colleges sought an increase in the fee. However, it

was decided to increase it only by 10%," Dr Patil said.

He added that admissions would be based on the state merit list of the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test and preparations were on to begin counselling by July 5.

Counselling for seats in government, private and religious and linguistic minority colleges will be conducted by the Karnataka Examinations Authority (KEA). In the case of deemed universities, counselling will be conducted by Directorate General Of Health Services (DGHS).

Addn 350 seats

This year, additional 350 seats will be available in government medical colleges for MBBS aspirants. The number of seats has increased from 100 to 150 in government medical colleges in Shivamogga, Hassan, Bidar, Belagavi, Raichur and Mandya. At Karnataka Institute of Medical Sciences, Hubballi, the intake will increase from 150 to 200 seats.

MBBS, dental fees up 10% every year, for next 3 years

Bengaluru: The Karnataka government has given in to the demands of private institutions and agreed to increase medical and dental course fees by 10% a year.

Medical education minister Sharanprakash Patil told reporters on Wednesday that the decision was taken after meeting management representatives of private medical colleges.

As per the revised structure, for academic year 2017-18, fee for a merit seat under NEET ranking will be Rs 77,000 in a private medical college as against the existing Rs 70,000 per year.

For management quota seats, the medical course fee will be Rs 6.32 lakh as opposed to the existing Rs 5.75 lakh. For the dental course, the fees will be Rs 49,000 under NEET and Rs 4.29 lakh for management quota seats.

With this, merit quota seats under NEET will not be less than Rs 1 lakh by 2020 and management quota seats will touch Rs 10 lakh.

will continue for the next three years till which time the government will allow the 10% on a year-on-year basis. After three years, the consensual agreement will be renewed," the minister said.

Patil said the state government has agreed to the demands of private management which said the fee structure in Karnataka was much lower compared to other states in the country. "They showed the statistics and numbers which suggested that the fees of private medical seats were the lowest in Karnataka when compated to MBBS and dental

courses in other states in the country," he said.

With this fee structure, merit quota seats under NEET will not be less than Rs 1 lakh by 2020 and management quota seats for MBBS degree will touch Rs 10 lakh.

Asked whether there will be changes in the fee structure for government colleges, Patil said the fee will remain at Rs 16,000 per year.

The state government has added 350 more MBBS seats to its existing government college seats from this academic year. Patil said the seats in Bidar, Raichur, Mandya, Hassan, Shivamogga, Belagavi and Hubballi medical colleges have increased by 50 seats each.
