

# National Eligibility Cum Entrance Test **NEET - MDS 2018**



**National Board of Examinations** 

### (For admission to MDS 2018 Academic Session)

- NEET-MDS 2018 is a single window entrance examination for all Dental PG courses -2018 Admission Session. No other entrance examination, either at state or institution level, shall be valid for entry to MDS Courses.
- NBE shall be conducting NEET-MDS as a Computer Based Test (CBT) on 7<sup>th</sup> January 2018 in a single session at all the test centres.

#### Eligibility Criteria for NEET-MDS 2018

A candidate for admission to the Master in Dental Surgery course, must possess a recognised degree of Bachelor in Dental Surgery awarded by a university or institute in India and registered with the State Dental Council and has obtained provisional or permanent registration and has undergone compulsory rotatory internship of one year in an approved/recognised dental college. The cutoff date for completion of internship towards determination of eligibility for appearing in NEET-MDS 2018 shall be 31st March, 2018


### Applying for NEET-MDS 2018

 Candidates can register for NEET-MDS through online portal from 31" October, 2017 to 27th November, 2017. Candidates can choose the exam city through online registration system on first come first serve basis.













## Total shutdown of all private hospitals on November 3

Upset over the State government's plan to regulate the healthcare system through amendments to the Karnataka Private Medical Establishments (KPME) Act, the State unit of Indian Medical Association has called for a total shutdown of all medical establishments in the State on November 3.

The government is all set to table the amended Bill in the winter session of the legislature to be held in Belagavi.

Following the joint select committees final report to Assembly Speaker K.B. Koliwad, the associations of private doctors have now decided to protest by shutting down all their establishments on November 3. A decision to this effect was taken at the IMA's meeting held at Gadag on October 28, said IMA President H.N. Ravindra.
