NEET in Kannada, exam on May 7

NEW DELHI, DHNS: The Central Board of Secondary Education will hold the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) on May 7 for admissions to all medical and dental colleges except for those established by an Act of Parliament, like All Indian Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS).

Announcing the date for the test to be held in 80 cities across the country, the school board opened the registration of candidates for it from Tuesday.

The test will be conducted in 10 languages: Kannada, Tamil, Telugu, Marathi, Odia, Gujarati, Bengali, Assamese, Hindi and English. The results are expected to be be declared on June 8, according to the information brochure released by the CBSE.

"Candidates can submit online application for NEET-2017 from January 31 to March 1," the school board said in a statement.

The upper age limit of the candidates has been fixed at 25 years as on the date of the conduct of the NEET. Candidates belonging to the reserved category will get a relaxation in the upper age limit of five years, the CBSE said.

"There shall be three at-

tempts available uniformly to all the candidates applying for NEET," it added.

The NEET will be conducted for admission to MBBS/BDS programmes of all medical and

While applying for the test online, the candidates of all states except Jammu and Kashmir, Assam and Meghalaya, will have to submit their Aadhaar numbers.

"In this regard, based on the Aadhaar Act, the CBSE has issued a public notice to make the candidates aware. Detailed information and information bulletin along with the frequently asked questions have been uploaded on NEET website for students," the board said.

The NEET will be conducted for admission to MBBS/BDS programmes of all medical and dental colleges approved by the Medical Council of India/Dental Council of India, except for those of the institutions established through an Act of Parliament like AIIMS and JIP-MER Puducherry, the CBSE said.

At least 1,500 centres will be identified and finalised on "vigorous parameters" to hold the test. More than 10 lakh candidates are expected to register for taking NEET this year, board's spokesperson Rama Sharma said.

BENGALURU: The Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has decided to allow candidates to take the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) in Kannada. The Kannada-medium paper, like all other language papers, will also have questions in English.

On Tuesday evening, the Central Board of Secondary Education opened online applications for NEET (UG) and announced that candidates could take the test in Kannada and seven other regional languages — Gujarati, Marathi, Oriya, Bengali, Assamese, Tamil and Telugu.

ister Sharan Prakash Patil said it was a positive move and hoped that it will help students in the State.

Earlier in December, the Union government announced that the exam would be held in six regional languages and English and Hindi. As this did not include Kannada, several Kannada organisations had called for its inclusion.

TN tables Bills for exemption from NEET

CHENNAI: Tamil Nadu on Tuesday became the first State to introduce Bills in the Legislative Assembly to exempt aspirants from appearing for the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) to get admission into medical and dental colleges.

The Tamil Nadu Admission to MBBS and BDS Courses Bill-2017, tabled by Health Minister C. Vijaya Baskar, seeks to admit students to undergraduate medical courses based on their scores in the Plus Two board examinations.

Separately, the Tamil Nadu Admission to Postgraduate Courses in Medicine and Dentistry Bill, 2017 seeks to admit students for postgraduate medical/dental courses based on marks obtained in the qualifying undergraduate exams. Both the Bills are expected to have smooth passage in the House considering that all political parties in State have rallied against conducting NEET,

The first Bill stated that the bulk of students in Tamil Nadu come from rural areas and they do not have access to or financial means to attend coaching classes to equip themselves for NEET.

As for admission to postmedical graduate programmes, the Bill stated that the present system of admissions ensured quality healthcare to people of Tamil Nadu, especially those living in rural, remote and hilly areas. Currently, over 50% cent of the seats are filled on the condition that that those on government service serve till superannuation or (non-service doctors) serve the government for at least two years. If NEET were to be conducted, the scheme being followed by the State government in regard to admission to such courses "would be thrown out of gear," it stated.
