

Both our students and faculty continue to achieve remarkable heights in academics, including teaching, learning, evaluation, as well as in non-academic pursuits such as sports,

cultural events, and the delivery of quality patient care and community health services.

Promoting a culture of research is one of our key objectives, and we have seen a substantial increase in research projects and publications in recent years.

Teaching: Our Medical College boasts excellent infrastructure and facilities for training both undergraduate and postgraduate students. Library: Our Medical College Library provides excellent infrastructure and learning resources that are regularly updated to cater to the needs of our students and faculty. It subscribes to a vast collection of journals, including foreign ejournals and various research service support tools such as Grammarly and Turnitin.

Faculty and Student Research Activities: To promote research, we have established a Modern Central Diagnostic Laboratory and a Centre for Advanced Research and Excellence (CARE) on our campus. Our students are


Recognitions and Achievements: Our faculty members have achieved several recognitions and accolades, including awards, fellowships, and memberships in national and international

R L Jalappa Hospital and Research Center, attached to Sri Devaraj Urs Medical College, established in 1994, aims to provide accessible, high-quality healthcare to the residents of Kolar and surrounding areas and contributes to medical science through research. Serving as an 1125-bed tertiary care multi-speciality facility, it stands out in emergency medical and surgical care, especially for critical and highrisk cases, and is the only centre providing super speciality services in the region.

The hospital provides affordable, inclusive and integrated approach to quality healthcare by including the services from Department of Cell biology and Molecular Genetics, Speech Pathology and Audiology, Physiotherapy, Department of Integrated Medicine and Department of Nutrition & Dietetics, Department of Nephrology and dialysis unit and Narayana Hrudayalaya.

During 2022 the hospital has provided 3,98,514 Outpatient care, 2,95,601 Inpatient care and more than 37,133 emergency medical and surgical care. The Central Diagnostic Laboratory Services has provided almost 15 lakhs i.e., 15,20,859 laboratory investigations. The hospital has performed 23,219 major and minor surgeries and conducted 2,319 deliveries in obstetric care services.

It is an exclusive healthcare facility in the region to have earned full accreditation from NABL and NABH. This recognition reaffirms the hospital's commitment to maintaining exceptional quality standards and providing exemplary healthcare services to the community.

The Quality cell of hospital organized various workshops, guest lectures and faculty development programmes for its staff like, POI workshop for NABH, Patient safety skills, Safe medication practices, Clinical audit training, Medical certification of cause of death, Hands on skill Basic Life Support, Advanced Cardiac Life Support, Pediatric Advanced Life Support, Neonatal Advanced Life Support, advanced simulation skills for up-gradation of clinical competencies along with mock drills on patient safety codes to prepare for the next cycle of quality accreditations.

In collaboration with the department of Microbiology, SDUMC, the hospital has introduced Truenat PCR tests as an advancement in laboratory services. The Department of Biochemistry has implemented a screening program for newborns to detect hypothyroidism at an early stage, facilitating timely treatment and preventing associated complications such as subnormal IQ. Furthermore, the hospital now offers tests for procalcitonin, aiding in the judicious use of

antibiotics through rationalized decision-making. These initiatives reflect R.L. Jalappa Hospital's commitment to leveraging cutting-edge technology for improved patient care and better health outcomes.

Our hospital provides a wide range of Oncological services, encompassing Medical, Surgical and Radiation oncology, to ensure comprehensive care for cancer patients and also offer a Master Health Checkup package, with various health assessments and laboratory investigations which promotes early disease detection. The Blood bank caters to all the transfusion needs of our patients and annually approximately fifteen thousand units of blood and blood products.

Considering Kolar's status as an economically challenged district in Karnataka, which shares administrative and political borders with neighbouring states, the hospital in association with the Department of Community Medicine has significantly expanded its healthcare outreach initiatives, organizing over 127 'Health Care Camps'.

In November 2022, R.L. Jalappa Hospital and Research Centre received two prestigious awards from the Quality Council of India for its outstanding efforts in promoting a culture of safety, accountability, and high reliability within the tertiary care setting and for implementation of best practices as part of their Quality Month plans, highlighting their commitment to excellence.

As part of our future plans, R.L. Jalappa Hospital has exciting initiatives underway:

Infrastructure Expansion: Two additional floors to expand the hospital's infrastructure.

Diabetes Care Center: To be a recognized centre for diabetes care.

Infertility Treatment Center: To initiate an infertility treatment centre in collaboration with Genea Fertility Centre Bangalore.

Neuro development Services and Newborn Screening: Introducing neuro development services and screening for metabolic disorders in newborns.

Corporate Super Specialty Healthcare Facility: To construct and dedicate a corporate super specialty healthcare facility with 50 beds.

These future plans reflect our continuous efforts to expand our infrastructure, enhance specialized care, and provide comprehensive healthcare services to our valued patients and the community we serve.







Darwin's Theory = **Dashavatar**

Introduction:

Today all over the World, science students read and believe Charles Darwin's theory of evolution. In 1830-35 Darwin at *Galapagos Islands* (Latin America) observed, that life is evolved in water. All species on the earth from fish to flowers, from banana to birds, have common ancestors. They struggled continuously and started rearranging their genes, their shape, their size, their food habits, selective mating, and finally got new offspring's, that have completely evolved. "Struggle for existence and survival of fittest", Life evolved in water, from amphibians to terrestrial animals. On the earth it took around 1000s of years to evolve from monkeys to primitive man and finally to present day human beings. When we sit and read *Bhagavatpurana*, *Garuda purana*, *Lord Vishnu* has taken *Dashavatar* (10 avatars).

Each and every avatar is inter related, and resembles Darwin's theory. Lord Vishnu's first incarnation in water is in the form of fish (Matsya avatar), it fulfills Darwin's theory of life evolved in water. 2nd avatar is tortoise (Kurma avatar), it is an amphibian, it fulfills Darwin's theory of continuous struggle of fishes to change and adapt to the amphibian life. 3rd avatar is boar (Varaha avatar, Pig), which is a totally terrestrial. Amphibians have struggled continuously to adapt to the terrestrial life. Boar reminds us about the dinosaurs that lived on the earth 1000s of years earlier. 4th avatar is *Narasimha avatar*, in which body is human form, face and hands are of lion. 5th avatar is Vamana avatar, short and intelligent human. 6th avatar is Parshurama avatar, an axe man who stayed in the jungle. 7th avatar is Rama avatar, a gentle man, who followed monogamy, and is called "Maryada Purushottam". 8th avatar is Krishna avatar, who is wise, shrewd statesman (Today's politician). 9th avatar is Buddha avatar, Buddha is a pursuit of happiness. 10th avatar is Kalki avatar, a man with weapons, Technohumanoid man of tomorrow.

Friends, now it is clear that Darwin's theory correlates with pattern of Dashavatar. "If the Dashavatar was just a *figment* of someone's imagination, how is it possible that entire evolutionary theory is right with such precision? Does this mean that our ancestors knew things that we are discovering now?"

Our ancestors depicted the evolutionary theory in the form of simple and easily understandable stories. In this

picture we witness the similarity between the Darwin's theory and the dashavatar.

Charles Darwin:

Charles Darwin was born in a small town called Mount (England), on 12th February 1809. His father was a popular doctor; he wanted his son to take up medicine as his career. Darwin joined **HMS Beagle** (name of the ship) group as a scientist, and his sea journey began on 27th March 1831, from England towards Latin America. The ship sailed for 5 years from one island to another island. In each island he studied the animals, fossils, flowers, fruits, and the men on the island. He collected large number of fossils, animals, flowers from Galapagos Islands, Falkland Island, studied carefully, and noted every observation. On 2nd October 1836, he came back to England, and shared all his observations and fossils with his good scientist friends, like botany professor, zoology professor, nature scientist, and Geologist. He and all his friends concluded, "Life evolved over 100s of year in water in the from simple single cell creature into complex multicellular organism". The aquatic animals slowly started changing their habitat from water to earth, by changing their body shape, body color, and food habits. Initially they had changed to 100 feet animals like centipedes, then to four legged animals, and later to two feet human beings. Many changes are noticed in human beings from dwarf man to man with weapons to intelligent human beings. Next change in humans will be his intelligence, and he will become a super human with modern computers and lethal weapons. These weapons will be the destruction of this beautiful World. During evolution, only those animals which change from good to better, from better to best, and who continue to produce their offspring are the only animals to survive in this World. Darwin's theory in short "Struggle for existence and survival of fittest".

Dashavatar:

Our sages narrated the entire evolutionary theory in the form of stories. Children also can understand these complex theories easily. Darwin's common ancestor for all plants, animals, and human is from Lord Vishnu. Lord Vishnu takes Dashavatar, 10 avatars which destroys evil people, and protects good people and protects our earth and our environment.



Darwin's Theory = Dashavatar

1st avatar is Matsya avatar

Matsya is the fish avatar of the 10 primary avatars of Hindu god Vishnu. Lord Vishnu in the form of fish comes to Cherivi River and appears to king Manu and tells him about end of the Yuga, where entire earth will be submerged in flood water soon. You build a ship and take all your people, all types of grains, and all types of animals in the ship, and tie to my horns. I will take you to a safe place; you start new Yuga, new beginning of the life on earth. Matsya avatar Vishnu also kills demon Hyagriva, and brings the Vedas and give them to Satyvrata sage and Saptarishis for their study.

2nd avatar is Kurma avatar:

Kurma is the 2nd avatar of Vishnu. Kurma appears at a time of crisis to restore the cosmic equilibrium. Kurma appear as tortoise or as half man-half tortoise. Sage Durvasa curses Devas (Gods) to lose their powers because they ignored him. The Devas needed nectar of immortality (Amrit) to overcome the curse, and they make an agreement with the Asuras (Demons) to churn the ocean of milk. They used Mount Mandara as the churning staff, and the serpent Vasuki as the churning rope, while the Kurma (Tortoise) bore the mountain on his back, so that they could churn the ocean easily.

3rd avatar is Varaha avatar:

Varaha appear as a boar, or boar's head and human body. When the demon Hiranyaksha troubles the Bhudevi (Earth) and its inhabitants, and sinks them in primordial waters, Vishnu takes the form of Varaha and descended into the depths of the oceans to rescue earth and its inhabitants, killing Hiranyaksha.

4th avatar is Narasimha avatar:

Narasimha appear as human body, with a lion face and claws. He kills the demon Hiranyakashipu. He kills the demon by placing demon on his laps, and tearing his body with his claws.

5th avatar is Vamana avatar:

Lord Vishnu takes the form of Vamana (Dwarf man) to restore cosmic balance by defeating the Asura king Mahabali (Bali chakravarti). Mahabali acquires disproportionate power over the Universe. The demon king sponsors a sacrifice and gift giving ceremony to strengthen his power. Vishnu appears as dwarf beggar, and asks for three paces (Foot) of land. Mahabali grants three paces of land. Vamana then grows into a giant of cosmic proportions. In one step he covers the earth, in another the heaven, for the third, Mahabali offers his head on which Vamana steps sending the demon king to the Patala and protects the earth and its inhabitants.

6th avatar is Parshurama avatar:

Parshurama is son of sage Jamadagni and RenukaYellamma. Sage Jamadagni had celestial cow called Surabi. Surabi had special powers to produce everything, what Jamadagni desired, hence it was called Kamadenu. Kshatriya king KartaviryaArjuna, forcefully snatches Kamadenu from Jamadagni. Parshurama

challenges KartaviryaArjuna and kills him in battle. Followers of KartaviryaArjuna challenges Parshurama, and in fight all of them were killed. Parshurama was a warrior sadhu, a sage, and teacher of martial arts.

7th avatar is Sri Rama:

Sri Rama, the son of king Dasharatha, marries the daughter of Janaka Maharaja Sita. Demon Ravana abducts Sita, and in a battle Ravana was killed. From Sri Rama and Sita's life we learn how to live in society, how to respect our parents, our relatives, our teachers, our friends, and our enemies also. Sri Rama is called Maryada Purushottam. His life taught us Monogamy and Monoandry. All scholars respect him as "Daivam Maanusharoopena". God has come in the form of man.

8th avatar is Sri Krishna:

Sri Krishna is a clever and shrewd person, who plays tricks with human mind. Arjuna was not willing to fight with his own kith and kin. He counseled so well that Arjuna took up the bow and arrow and fought. He helped the needy, punished the evil. He is successful politician.

9th avatar is Buddha:

Buddha is the pursuit of happiness. He taught us life is Dukkha (Sorrow), dukkha arise from craving and greediness, and that if we control greediness, selfishness, and jealousness, we can overcome dukkha. He also taught death is eternal; everybody on the earth has to die.

10th avatar is Kalki avatar:

Purana teaches us that, Lord Vishnu has completed already 9 avatars, 10thKalki avatar is due. Kalki is supposed to come on white horse with wings, with all lethal weapons. He is man of tomorrow. His lethal weapons will destroy entire World, end of present Kali Yuga, and once again Nobel Sathya Yuga will start.

Conclusion:

Friends, our sages perfectly narrated the Dashavatar, which almost tallies with Darwin's evolutionary theory. They could predict the Solar and Lunar eclipse much earlier than the scientists. 

"No physician, however conscientious or careful, can tell what day or hour he may not be the object of some undeserved attack, malicious accusation, black mail or suit for damage." -

JAMA, 1892.

The above quoted highlights the fact that violence against doctors isn't something new, but goes back to over a century, if not more. The problem has persisted for so

long that this may sound like a prophecy and be an eyeopener in the 21st century!

Now imagine this!

You've had a hard working day in your clinic and hospital. Still there are some more patients waiting to be attended and it's time for your lunch. You ask the patients to

wait for a while. But suddenly some patients start arguing with you, pushing you and then attacking you. You go speechless as it was totally unexpected nor prepared for

such a situation. Before you know, you're being punched, kicked and stabbed! Sounds scary right? Well, for many doctors it has been a reality! Just take a seat back and analyse. Just google "VIOLENCE AGAINST DOCTORS IN INDIA" and you'll be surprised just reading the amount of such incidences in one year alone. But it's not a question of just that particular year. Unfortunately this has been a growing trend since years.

The medical profession demands hard work almost round the clock. Being a doctor calls for involvement, respect and willingness to help all other people.

But is that all?

Is that how a doctor is perceived? A doctor in India is expected to be brilliant, be willing to study for hours and years, take responsibility for anything going wrong, take

duties in rounds over and over. In fact they're supposed to be GODS! If you think doctors are akin to Gods, then I'm sorry to break it to you but, they most definitely are not. They're as human as the patients they treat. They aren't magicians or wizards either.

Last few years, reports of violence against doctors, sometimes even leading to grievous hurt or murder are making headlines and ruling news channels. The recent incident of the murder of house surgeon Dr Vandana Das in Kerala sent shockwaves across the country. Her death also calls for a check on the contingency of medicos all over the globe because for how long will luck favour them?

For thousands of ordinary parents who invest their life savings in their child's medical education with the hope of

a secure and bright future, for whom a child becoming a doctor, is a matter of great pride. If you speak to an aspiring doctor's parents they'd tell you how they feel about sending their child into a rather dangerous battlefield. They fear this because some mindless drunkard will storm into the hospital with a 100 other similar ones, and beat the life out of the bundle of aspirations and dreams. It will only be a miracle if the young doctor survives the attack.

Now, what makes you think that the young doctors who are investing their time, energy and youth for ungrateful patients who are seeking for opportunities to beat

them up? We expect doctors to take all the downside, get paid a lot less than people of similar intelligence do in other fields and threaten them too. We call it unfair and morally guilt them and ask them why they became a doctor in the first place. And now that the doctor is attacked, think what happens next! Agitations , protests and doctors' strikes immediately follow. But nothing major happens after that. After about a week of gradually weaning discussions and debates, the issue dies down, the Hippocratic Oath kicks in and residents and interns and all other protesting doctors get back to work, only to be assaulted again. Understand !! No doctor enters a hospital with the intention of harming a patient.

Revised after long years, the new undergraduate curriculum titled "Competency-Based Medical Education", essentially marks a significant shift from the classroom oriented learning programme to one which stresses on medical ethics, better doctor-patient relationship and outcome-based learning. The newly added AETCOM session will now run across years. But is that enough? Will this solve the havoc we're inviting our way?

Absolutely not !!

Although violence against doctors and other health workers is not uncommon, the incidence in India seems to be alarming and increasing. As there are certain responsibilities of doctors and other healthcare workers, similarly, responsibilities also have to be borne by patients and their relatives as well. The greatest danger to the future is apathy. Though the journey is long and the road is really strenuous but if we the people of fraternity, the medical professionals don't take a stand for ourselves then we can't expect anybody else to do so too. We need to unite and fight for ourselves and our future.
